7th Grade Social Studies – U.S. History - Syllabus Mr. Gerber

Description of Course

Seventh grade Social Studies is a 5 theme Social Studies course that will cover concepts such as **geography**, **history**, **political science**, **economics**, and **behavioral science**. In addition, we will look at both Wisconsin and local history as it relates to our overall concepts. The year will begin with the colonization of the region of North America that will become the United States of America. We'll discuss the development of the colonies and the civic disruption that resulted in the American Revolution and the formation of the nation. We'll follow American history throughout the turbulent years following the birth of the nation, US relations with its neighbors and indigenous peoples, and the eventual spread of American power across the continent. We'll discuss war, industrialization, social and political revolutions, and significance of slavery on American history. The year will conclude with America's involvement in WWI and the resulting impact of the world's first 'world war'.

Grading Policy

Each quarter students will be given <u>at least</u> one assignment, per objective. These graded assessments will count towards their overall grade for each objective per quarter. Tests and/or quizzes will be administered based on the needs of the class as determined by the teacher.

All assignments, including objectives on each test, will be worth 10 points. At the end of the quarter, these grades will be averaged, and that total will represent their objective score. The average of all objective scores will equate to their overall grade. In the event that the student scores a 3 on any particular assignment, this is an indication that the student either did not turn in the assignment or was caught engaging in academic fraud, i.e. cheating.

Homework Policy
