MAPS Round 2 Assessments

Students in grades 2-5 will be participating in the second round of MAPS assessment in reading, language and math. This online screener allows us the opportunity to see student growth throughout the year that is aligned to the Common Core State Standards. Each of your children selected their own S.M.A.R.T. goals to achieve that they felt would help them show growth and success in their learning. We are excited to share these results with you at Parent Teacher Conferences. We will also be completing a 3rd and final round in spring after the Wisconsin State Forward Exam (grades 3-5).

Reminder of Student Absences

State statue and school board policy requires the school to send letters notifying parents if students have missed part or all of 5 days a semester and/or 10 days a year. Student Returning to School After Non-Covid related illnesses

- Students may return to school after being fever free for 24 hours without use of fever reducing medicine if he/she is feeling better
- Students may return 24 hours after last episode of vomiting/diarrhea if he/she is feeling better
- Students may return 24 hours following his/her first dose of an antibiotic for infection (i.e. strep throat) if he/she is feeling better

PURDY SCHOOL PLAYGROUND RULES Revised 5-11-21

BALLGAME RULES

No kicking or throwing ball on roof or against walls. No hardballs or baseballs. No bats, softballs on blacktop – only rubber balls. Ask permission to retrieve ball over fence or in parking lot. No CLOSED games. No rugby. Football – 2 handed touch – NO tackling. Tag - 1 handed touch

JUMP ROPE RULES

Jump ropes are for jumping ONLY. No typing each other up. No tug-of-war with rope. No helicopter with rope. Take turns. Tie dangling shoclaces. No shoes off.

CLIMBING EQUIPMENT

Wait your turn. No pushing. One at a time. No penny drops. No jumping on bridges or chains. No walking across bars while standing. No tag on equipment.

SWING RULES

No twisting – swing straight. No under-ducks. Sitting ONLY. No jumping out of swings. No climbing on swing lets.

TIRE SWING RULES

No laying on tire swing. No more than 2 people on tire swing at a time. No hanging back or under tire swing. No aggressive pushing, and/or swinging tire swing.

SLIDE RULES

Feet first, sitting only. No stones, wood chips or balls on the slides. One at a time. No climbing the poles. No blocking the bottom of slide. No walking or crawling up the slide. No climbing on tunnel covers. No jumping off the side of slide.

GENERAL RULES

No kicking, wrestling, hanging onto someone clothing or choking Use restrooms before going outside. No entering building without permission. No foul or inappropriate language. No name-calling. No candy, gum or food from lunch on playgro Hands off other students. Respect school property. Respect adults at all times. If unsure of a rule, ASK. No lifting or carrying anyone. No flips. No playing by windows or ledges. Stay out of doorways. No touching, climbing or swinging on trees. Use bottom two bleacher seats. Share equipment. Don't go beyond ball diamond to play soccer. Stand behind yellow line when lining up. No burying others in tire chips or wood chips

WINTER/SNOW RULES

See other side.

PURDY SCHOOL WINTER/SNOW RULES

Before going outside on cold days make sure snow pants are on, coats are zipped, snow boots are tied, mittens are on, hats are on and/or hood is up.

Students need to stay seated when going down slides and should land on their feet.

No throwing snowballs, snow in the air, on the equipment or against the building. Sno designs can be made on the building.

Children need both snow pants and snow boots to go off the blacktop when snow is on the ground.

5. No sliding on ice.

No eating snow.

7. No running on snow mounds.

8. Stay off equipment if slippery or covered with snow.

No "washing each others faces" in snow or putting snow down someone's back.

10. No pushing people off of snow mounds or down in the snow (i.e. "King of the Hill").

11. Don't ruin someone else's snow art or snow forts.

12. No climbing on snow mounds next to parking lots or driveways.

3. No kicking or throwing ice chunks on the blacktop.

14. No climbing on snow mounds by parking lot.

15. Stay away from puddles - GO AROUND!

- 14. Brush snow off clothes before entering the building.
- 15. Stomp feet on rug before going to take off coats.
- 16. If the temperature is below 50 degrees, coats must be worn.

Engagement Opportunities Ahead

Thank you for providing your feedback, and sharing our Community Survey in November! This survey asked questions regarding operational referendum costs, thoughts on building a new middle school, security enhancements, and urgent maintenance needs. The results of the survey will be shared at the Board of Education meeting on Thursday, December 16th.

The first step in the engagement process began in 2019 with a group of close to <u>30 community</u> <u>members conducting a full strategic facilities planning</u> assessment and recommendation to the Board. The community survey was the second step in the engagement process. Through the Spring, the District will be holding a number of community engagement sessions to dive into these topics deeper.
