Southern Lakes Anthology Project

What is the Southern Lakes Anthology Project?

The Southern Lakes Anthology Project is sponsored by the Southern Lakes Advanced Learners Network. The purpose of the Anthology is to provide an opportunity for talented writers, artists, and cartoonists to publish their work. During the months of October and November, students will receive more information about the project and this year's theme, "One in a Million."

Who can submit work?

School District of Fort Atkinson students in Grades 3 through 8 may submit pieces for judging.

Why should students consider submitting their work?

Southern Lakes Anthology provides an authentic audience for young writers and artists. The top entries from Fort Atkinson are published in a local anthology and also sent to regional judging. If selected at the regional level, the pieces are published in a book along with works by other students in southeastern Wisconsin. Published students are invited to a recognition ceremony in May where they receive a free copy of the book.

How are the pieces chosen?

Pieces must communicate a message based on the year's theme. Art, cartoons, and illustrations (in illustrated writing) are also judged on originality, neatness, space, and composition. Artwork should have strong black and white contrast-black pen or marker carefully used

over very light pencil works great! Writing pieces are judged on relevance to the theme, clarity of ideas, organization, sentence fluency, word choice, conventions, and voice.

All work must be a student's original work. Parents and teachers may provide editing assistance. Specific rules and guidelines regarding page limits, font size and margin widths, as well as templates for art/illustration pieces, will be available.

November 2022 Referendum

The Needs:

- Operational Funding needed to continue current programming and services due to the expiration of the 2020 referendum
- <u>Capital</u> Building secure entrances, addressing urgent maintenance needs at all six District schools, and improving traffic flow at the high school site

The Solution: Operational Referendum (Question 1 on Ballot)



Recurring \$3 million beginning in 2023

> \$4 million non-recurring in 2023-24 and 2024-25 \$5 million non-recurring in 2025-26

The Solution: Capital Referendum (Question 2 on Ballot)



\$22 million in general obligation bonds to include:
Build secure entries at all six schools
Address urgent maintenance needs at all six schools
Improve traffic flow at the high school







Stable Public School Tax Rate

The Board of Education consistently considers the fiscal impact on taxpayers within the budget process. As a result, **the proposed referendum keeps the public school tax rate stable**.



Attendance Matters!

Many of us are familiar with the traffic light. When we think about attendance we can use this to help picture how we are doing. How has your childs' attendance been for the first quarter? You can use Powerschool to see how many days they have attended—there were 39 days in the first quarter.



Red-Out of school for 10% or more of the time-means missing 18 or more days during the school year.

- Both excused and unexcused absences represent lost time in the classroom. It also means missed opportunities to learn and may put your child behind their peers.
- For the first quarter it means being absent from school for 4 or more days.

Yellow-Out of school for 6 to 9% of the time--means missing between 10-17 days during the school

- Students who average 15 days of absences each year miss about 1 full year of school by the time they are in 12th grade.
- For the first quarter it means being absent 2 3 days.

Green–Out of school for 5% or less of the time–means missing fewer than 9 days during the school year.

- Students in this category generally achieve higher grades and enjoy school more.
- For the first quarter it means being absent fewer than 2 days

We recognize there are times when students are not able to attend because they are ill or showing symptoms of illness and it is best for them to stay home. If that is the case, please be sure to contact the attendance office. But as long as your child is healthy, we believe it is important for them to be at school all day, every day.
