

ADMINISTRATIVE RULE 449

AR 449 - Protests, Demonstrations and Disruptions

Students shall have a right to a safe, nonthreatening learning environment. Any students involved in a disruption will be informed of their responsibility to attend regular scheduled classes. Disruptive students will be requested to clear the area.

Disruptive students who refuse to attend classes or follow directions will be suspended under Wisconsin Statute 120.13 and parents/guardians will be contacted and requested to come to school to remove the student from the school premises.

Students will be suspended no longer than five consecutive days. A conference among parent/guardian, violator and principal will be scheduled to discuss the implications of the disruption.

Parents/guardians will also be notified if disruptive students refuse to clear the hallways or classrooms and create a situation dangerous to the physical welfare of school personnel and students. Proper civil authorities will then be notified and requested to eject the students from the school building and campus and a charge of disorderly conduct will be officially filed.

Only properly matriculated students and staff will be permitted on the campus or in the buildings. All others must have permission from the school administration or their presence will be considered trespassing.
