Grant Eligibility

- CLC eligibility is for schools that have at least 40% or greater free and reduced lunch populations
- Also for schools that have academic gaps among specific populations
- Luther and Purdy Elementary are going into year four of this five year grant
- Grant monies go to support a broad range of activities that support student achievement in before and after school programs

Objectives of Grant Proposal

- Students will improve their overall literacy and mathematics skills
- Students will participate in a variety of enrichment activities including science, social studies, art, physical education, and volunteer opportunities
- Students and parents will be encouraged to complete literacy- and math-based activities in the home
- Students and families will participate in "Family Nights" that promote health and wellness activities

New Activities for 2013-2014

- After completing a required self-assessment of our CLC program, we will be implementing new elements
- Focus on physical fitness and getting students exercising before the academic power hour
- Emphasis on enrichment activities, including a community service volunteer project
- Implement an "Enhancement Fair" where students can put their products from a variety of enhancement activities on display for their parents to see

Grant Budget Highlights

- The grant application is for \$100,000
- Over \$60,000 going to pay licensed teachers to staff the before, after, and summer school programs
- Of this amount, over \$6,000 going to support teaching enrichment activities
- Over \$23,000 to pay for Boys and Girls Club support staff to work with our students during the school year and summer school block
