What is CLC?

- Before and After School academic support and enrichment activities in addition to family/community activities
- Student Qualification
 - School report card data, WKCE testing, Progress Wall data, Developmental Reading Assessment (DRA) data, PALS results (grades K-2), math Individual Profile of Progress (IPP) and teacher recommendation
 - Students identified as ELL and/or as free or reduced lunch
- Held at Luther and Purdy based on population
- Lead by certified teachers, many who are trained in Comprehensive Literacy Model

Fort School District History

- Luther and Purdy just completed first 5-year cycle
- Students meet 4 days a week
- Programs offered before school with breakfast and after school with BGC snack time
- Focus of learning on reading, math and homework support
- Summer CLC offers 2 hours of instruction after summer school one site
- Each site services their own students during school year

CLC Increasing Achievement

- Licensed teachers providing quality instruction with Common Core aligned curriculum
- Students gain additional minutes of instruction
- Inclusion of an interventionist to meet students and provide research based reading intervention
- Pre-teaching strategies to prepare for following day lessons
- Enrichment activities allow opportunities for building background knowledge

Partnerships

- Boys and Girls Club supports snack time and supervision of students
- CLC is automatic member of BGC
- Summer Program for CLC/BGC

Future Goals

- Adapt schedule to allow for a rotational experience to include additional enrichment activities (ie: Wellness Program, World Language)
- Continued development of community partnerships
- Planning and implementation of family/community involvement programs
- Increasing enrollment of the program through outreach to parochial schools
- Continued advertisement of transportation for those in need
