Mrs. Grossman is a problem solver with her students, with parents, with other teachers and administrators. All in all, Mrs. Grossman is one of the key people at Barrie that help define our learning community!

Mrs. Grossman has been married to her husband, Gary, for 33 years. Gary and Mahna have two children who graduated from Fort Atkinson High School: Ben (Class of 2000) and Becky (Class of 2003).
