Emerald Ash Borer (EAB)

- Native to Asia
- Destroys Green, White, Black and Blue Ash Trees

- S-Shaped Larval Galleries

- Crown Dieback



Signs of EAB cont

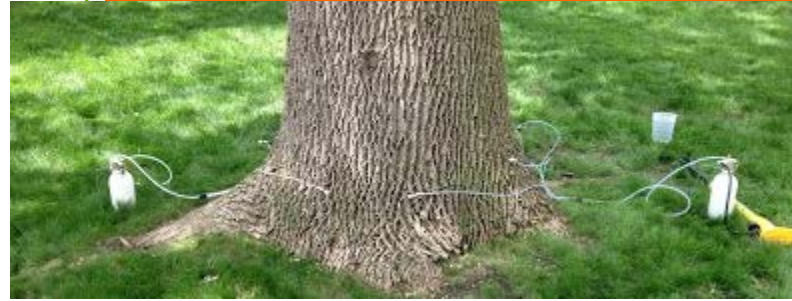
- Epicormic Sprouting



Other At Risk Trees

- Storm Damaged
- Dying





Remove vs Treat

- Remove
 - If over 20% crowning / dieback
 - S-Shaped Galleries
 - Small Ash Tree
 - Under 6" Diameter
 - Price range from \$100 to \$500 – One time expenditure
- Treat
 - No Guarantee
 - Must be healthy
 - Little to no crowning / dieback
 - Price range from \$150 to \$250 – Biannual expenditure



Steps Taken

- Identify Trees that are Ash and others at risk. Given recommendations of treat vs remove – Jefferson County Parks Department
- Confirm Recommendations with walk through Arborist Troy Schreiner
- Obtain Pricing for Treating and Removing

Moving Forward - Removal

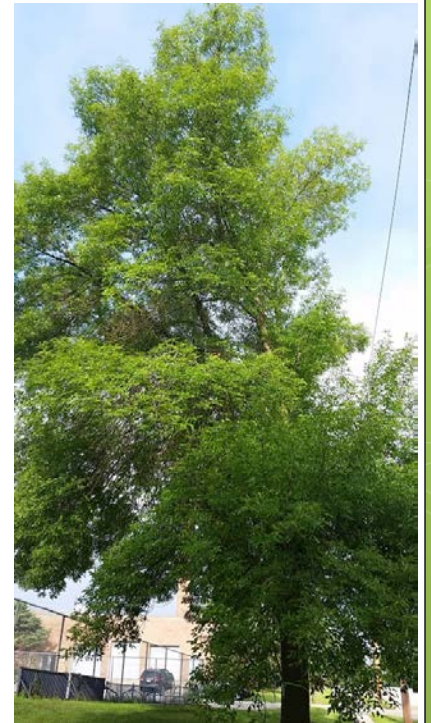
Ash and Other At Risk Trees

20 Ash Trees, 20 Other Trees

- Barrie – 2 Medium Ash, 1 Other
- Luther – 1 Large Ash, 1 Other
- Purdy – 1 Small Ash Tree, 3 Medium Ash
- Rockwell – 1 Large Ash, 1 Other
- Middle School – 2 Ash Trees, 2 Others
- High School – 10 Small Ash Trees, 15 Other

Moving Forward - Treat 16 Trees Total

- Barrie – 2 Medium Ash Trees
- Luther – 2 Large Ash, 1 Medium Ash
- Purdy – 2 Large Ash, 2 Medium Ash
- Rockwell – 4 Medium Ash Trees
- Middle School – 2 Large Ash Trees
- High School – 1 Medium Ash Tree
