PLACES and ENVIRONMENT	 Shelters of families are different in different parts of the world. All living things use the earth. People live in many different locations. People in a community do different kinds of work. People make choices about how to spend money. There is a difference between goods and services. A person's job results in producing goods and services.
SOCIETY, SCIENCE, and TECHNOLOGY	 The way people live has been impacted by inventions. Some things change over time while others stay the same.
CITIZENSHIP	 People follow steps to resolve a conflict. * Responsible citizens follow rules and laws. All individuals have rights. The United States has national symbols and landmarks that represent freedom. There have been important leaders for freedom in our country. Freedom provides the opportunity to make choices.
GLOBAL CONNECTIONS	 People can learn to speak different languages. Different cultures have different languages, beliefs, customs, ceremonies or traditions. Although Americans come from different backgrounds, they share some of the same beliefs. People trade goods and services with each other. Native Americans and immigrants have both helped define American culture.
