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

FROM THE NORTHEAST

Follow Hwy. 43 south to Hwy. 26 south. Follow Hwy. 26 south through Jefferson. Stay on Hwy. 26 (don't follow Business 26 into Fort Atkinson). Take the Hwy. 12 exit off Hwy. 26. Turn left onto Hwy. 12 East into Fort Atkinson. Turn left at the first traffic light onto the high school campus.

FROM THE NORTHWEST

From I-94 take the Hwy. 26 exit south. Follow Hwy. 26 south through Jefferson. Stay on Hwy. 26 (don't follow Business 26 into Fort Atkinson). Take the Hwy. 12 exit off Hwy. 26. Turn left onto Hwy. 12 East into Fort Atkinson. Turn left at the first traffic light onto the high school campus.

FROM THE EAST

Take I-94 west to the Hwy. 26 exit south. Follow Hwy. 26 south through Jefferson. Stay on Hwy. 26 (don't follow Business 26 into Fort Atkinson). Take the Hwy. 12 exit off Hwy. 26. Turn left onto Hwy. 12 East into Fort Atkinson. Turn left at the first traffic light onto the high school campus.

FROM THE WEST

Take Hwy. 12 from Madison through Cambridge into Fort Atkinson. Turn left at the first traffic light (just beyond the Hwy. 26 interchange) onto the high school campus.

FROM THE SOUTH

Take I-90 to the Hwy. 26 north exit. Follow Hwy. 26 north through Milton. Stay on Hwy. 26 (don't follow Business 26 into Fort Atkinson). Take the Hwy. 12 exit off Hwy. 26. Turn right onto Hwy. 12 East into Fort Atkinson. Turn left at the first traffic light onto the high school campus.

ARRIVAL PROCEDURES & OTHER INFORMATION

1. Follow maps for easy access to entrances. **There is a one-way loop to and around the school.** Follow signs posted on the loop. **Friday and Saturday** groups will unload at Lot B Entrance. **Friday** night groups will unload equipment at Lot B Entrance. MS SHOW CHOIRS: Will utilize the band room as their designated equipment storage area. Drivers are to back into the music wing driveway immediately past the front of the building. See map. **Saturday** groups will unload large equipment at Lot C Entrance. See map for detailed locations.
2. Upon arrival, all directors are asked to check in at an information table at **Lot B** Entrance.
3. An adult host will meet your bus and stamp student's hands on the bus. You will be provided free admission tickets for your chaperones (1 chaperone/10 students). Chaperones should take these passes to the admission desk where they will be given an armband. Student hosts will be assigned to meet your group and escort you to your homeroom. They will assist you in any way possible. Please allow appropriate preparation time so that you will be ready for all reporting times.
4. Bus Drivers and Choreographers will be admitted at no charge and should receive a hand stamp.
5. At your reporting times, your student host(s) will direct you from your homeroom to the warm-up area and to the performance area. Please be ready to move to the warm-up area 10 minutes prior to your scheduled warm-up time.
6. ****HIGH SCHOOL SHOW CHOIRS:** Each group will be assigned an 'A' side or 'B' side which will determine Stage entrance and exit for their performance. **"A" choirs will enter stage LEFT and exit stage LEFT. "B" choirs will enter stage RIGHT and exit stage RIGHT.****
7. HS SHOW CHOIRS: After your performance, all equipment may be returned to your homeroom. Large equipment may be returned to the holding area in the gym.
8. This is a NO SMOKING facility. Smoking is not permitted in the building or on the school grounds.
9. Responsibility clause: Fort Atkinson High School will not be responsible for any damaged equipment. Remind students to secure personal and group belongings.
10. The invitational will NOT be cancelled due to inclement weather conditions.



MS/JH SHOW CHOIR COMPETITION RULES

1. Groups in each category compete on an equal basis regardless of school size or competition experience.
2. **All groups will be allotted 25 minutes. This includes set-up, performance, and take down. Critique and clinic will be off stage.**
3. There will be two introductions. One long introduction which takes place during the timed set-up and a short introduction, which is not included in the time. Choirs are allotted a maximum of twenty-five (25) minutes on the performing stage. Timing will NOT be a factor in any penalty for the middle school show choir portion of the invitational. We insist that you adhere to the above request.
4. Groups are free to perform any style or type of music they wish. There is no minimum or maximum number of selections to be performed. Music need not be given to the judges.
5. Any type of instrumental accompaniment (including adults) may be used. Instrumental back-up accompaniment will not be used as a factor in the judging. Recorded accompaniments are acceptable. Please notify the stage manager upon arrival.
6. Directors may be on stage with their group and direct if they wish.
7. ALL EQUIPMENT must be brought on stage and removed from stage right.
8. We are not able to honor any special lighting requests including the use of house power or dimming of lights. At no time will fireworks, fire or other hazardous materials be allowed.
9. No smoke machines or other pyrotechnics can be used (the high school's smoke detection system is very sensitive). Fire extinguishers (CO2 type only) will be allowed. Dry ice will also be accepted.
10. The four (4) tiered layout will remain permanent throughout the competition. Requests to remove the top tier will not be granted.
11. Junior high/middle school show choirs may only be comprised of 6th, 7th, or 8th grade students. This does not include combo members.

HIGH SCHOOL SHOW CHOIR COMPETITION RULES

1. FORT SHOWCASE offers a prep class and an open class competition. Groups in each category compete on an equal basis regardless of school size or competition experience. Champions of the Prep Division will perform in exhibition at the beginning of the Finals Competition.
2. **All groups will be allotted 25 minutes. This includes set-up, performance, and take down. Critique and clinic will be off stage.**
3. There will be two introductions. Each group will have a long introduction, which takes place during the timed set-up. It will then be followed by a short introduction, which will not be included in the allotted time.
4. Choirs are allotted a maximum of twenty-five (25) minutes on the performing stage. Time will be kept by a contest official and begins when any member of the school's organization enters the stage or when music begins, even though no one may be on the stage. (Timing will stop when the director gives the OK to announcers to begin the short introduction and timing begins again as soon as the introduction is complete). Timing concludes when the last piece of your equipment has been removed and the last member has left the stage.
5. Groups are free to perform any style or type of music they wish. There is no minimum or maximum number of selections to be performed. Music need not be given to the judges.
6. Any type of instrumental accompaniment may be used and is judged as an integral part of the group's performance. **NO TAPED ACCOMPANIMENTS MAY BE USED.** All performers must be students in your school. **EXCEPTION:** the pianist may be an adult. ****Having an adult on a keyboard will NOT exemplify the group from the "Best Back-up Combo" award** If other adult musicians are used in the combo, prior approval will be necessary from Mr. Engstrom.**
7. Directors may be on stage with their group and direct if they wish.
8. ****Each group will be assigned an "A" side or "B" side, which will determine stage entrance and exit for their performance. "A" groups will enter stage Left and exit stage Left "B" groups will enter stage Right and exit stage Right.****
9. ALL EQUIPMENT must be brought on stage and removed from stage according to the stage Left "A" or stage Right "B" assignment for the group. (See performance schedule).
10. Performers must exit according to their "A" or "B" assignment. (See performance schedule)
11. We are not able to honor any special lighting requests including the use of house power or dimming of lights. At no time will fireworks, fire or other hazardous materials be allowed.
12. No smoke machines or other pyrotechnics can be used (the high school's smoke detection system is very sensitive). Fire extinguishers (CO2 type only) will be allowed. Dry ice will also be accepted. However, they must be plugged into the designated outlets behind stage. **NOT ON THE WALL of the gym or auditorium.**
13. **The four (4) tiered layout will remain permanent throughout the day. Requests to remove the top tier will not be allowed.**
14. Tap shoes must be removed after each performance before returning into the gym. This is to help protect the gymnasium floor.

Concert Choir Competition Rules

1. The Fort Showcase Concert Choir Competition is an OPEN contest. All Concert choirs will compete at the same level. School and choir size do not factor in the level of competition. Experience level also, does not factor.
2. Choirs are free to render any type of performance they wish.
3. Three sets of conductor's scores **MUST** be provided for the judges. All measures must be numbered. A 5-point deduction will be subtracted from the overall total if incompliant to this ruling. Photocopies will not be accepted. Groups that perform with photocopies will be disqualified. Accompanists may use a photocopy as long as an original is sitting on the piano during the performance.
4. Any type of accompaniment may be used and will be judged as an integral part of the group's performance. Piano, instrumental (including strings) are options. A Boston 6' Grand piano, seven 4-step risers, chairs and music stands will be provided for each group. Risers will be permanent on the stage. However, piano, chairs, and stands are moveable. Other instruments are your responsibility.
5. Each group is allotted a 25-minute time slot. From the downbeat of the first song through the end of your performance may not exceed 16-minutes. This will allow enough time for the on-stage critique. The critique will close out the remaining minutes of the allotted time.
6. Each group will receive a participation plaque. Please have two representatives from your choir be ready for the award ceremony following the FAHS Chamber Chorale Performance.
7. Directors may pick up their judging forms and recording at least 15 minutes after the awards presentation. Results will be in the High School IMC, located behind the common's elevator.
8. Any group that is NOT participating in the show choir competition, **MUST** clear out of their homeroom immediately following the awards ceremony or sooner.

HS SHOW CHOIR OPEN CLASS FINALS JUDGING PROCESS

Judging sheets will be the same for each judge. Each judge will evaluate vocal categories, movement categories, and “other” categories. Combo will be a separate evaluation and will not be included in overall totals. Enclosed find copies of the sheets being used by the judges.

Finals Round will be based on overall ranking from each judge. The clinicians and combo judge WILL NOT participate in judging the Finals Round. Judging sheets will be used again during finals by same judging panel from Preliminary Round. You will again be evaluated by using the same judging form as during the preliminary round. After judges have completed their forms, the total scores will be put into a ranking system by our tally staff. To give you a scenario see below:

Judge #1 scores per finalist & Score they will be assigned by tally staff

Finalist #1-92 assigned 19 points

Finalist #2-90 assigned 17 points

Finalist #3-86 assigned 14 points

Finalist #4-85 assigned 11 points

Finalist #5-82 assigned 9 points

Finalist #6-80 assigned 7 points

Each judge will work on this numbering. Then total points will be added and that will determine the order.

Example of one finalist scores:

Judge #1-19 points

Judge #2-14 points

Judge #3-19 points

Judge #4-11 points

Judge #5-19 points

Total for finalist #1=82 points

Then total points will determine the ranking from the 5th runner-up to Champion.

If a tie should occur, the group with the highest vocal score will be awarded the higher placing.


Your judging sheets and DVDs will be available after the Preliminary Round and final round. You may pick them up in the Invitational Headquarters found in the **Main Office near the front of the High School.**

CRITIQUE RECORDINGS: Judges critiques will be distributed via “Dropbox”. Directors were emailed a dropbox file. After your performance judge’s critiques will be uploaded to your own file. You may access these files as soon as they have been uploaded. This will be done throughout the day. You may access them from your computer, Ipad, Adroid phone, or Blackberry. PERFORMANCE STAGE • AUDITORIUM

MS/JH SHOW CHOIRS


The auditorium stage will be set up in the following dimensions: is 40' wide x 36' deep. On that stage you will have 8' in front; then an 8" high x 4' deep x 32' wide platform; then a 16" high x 4' deep x 32' wide platform; then a 24" high x 4' deep x 32' wide platform; then a 32" high x 4' deep x 32' wide platform. **Portions of the stage will NOT be moved.** This will leave a visible 4' on each side of the stage plus wing space. and 12' usable space behind the raised platforms. There will be 8' of stairs on each side leading to the stage. There will be a monitor for the combo.



Four shotgun microphone will be used for overall sound enforcement these are not to be moved or used for solo singing.
Five Wireless solo microphones will be available and moveable.

PERFORMANCE STAGE • HS SHOW CHOIRS • GYMNASIUM

The stage is 40' wide x 36' deep raised 32" off the gym floor. On that stage you will have 12' in front; then an 8" high x 4' deep x 32' wide platform; then a 16" high x 4' deep x 32' wide platform; then a 24" high x 4' deep x 32' wide platform; then a 32" high x 4' deep x 32' wide platform. **Portions of the stage will NOT be moved.** This will leave 4' on each side of the stage and 12' usable space behind the raised platforms. There will be 8' of stairs on each side leading to the stage.



Five Wireless solo microphones will be available and moveable.
Non-solo microphones are NOT to be touched or moved in any manner.

CONCERT CHOIR & MS/JH SHOW CHOIR CEREMONY

AWARDS PRESENTATION

The following format will be used for the presentation of awards:

1. Each director is asked to select two student representatives.
2. All students selected as representatives are to be in costumes for the presentation.
3. Representatives from each school will be asked to come forward to the stage area. There will be an assigned area for this presentation. Your room hosts will meet you on stage in your area.
4. At this time all groups will be acknowledged for their participation.
5. The following caption award will be presented for **MS/JH Show Choir**: Outstanding Soloist (only one). This will be followed by the announcement of 2nd runner-up, 1st runner-up, and Grand Champion. **This will take place following the Fort Atkinson Middle School's "4th Street Singers" performance.**
6. The following caption awards will be presented for **Concert Choir**: Outstanding soprano, alto, tenor, and bass sections. Followed by the announcement of 1st runner-up, and Grand Champion. This will take place immediately following the last concert choir to perform.

CONCERT CHOIR WARM-UP ROOM

Choirs will be warming up in the Orchestra Room (M118). There will be risers, music stands, and a piano for your use. Your host will escort you to the warm-up room until your "move to hallway" time. You will enter the auditorium stage right and will exit stage right. Choirs may choose to go directly into the house seats if they wish. Again, your host will lead you to the appropriate locations.

SHOW CHOIR WARM-UP ROOM

Choirs will be warming up in the choir room (M148). There will be Music stands, and a piano for your use. Your host will escort you to the warm-up room until your "move to hallway" time. You will enter the auditorium stage right and will exit stage left. Again, your host will lead you to the appropriate locations.

CONCERT CHOIRS--following performance

Following your performance, your choir will receive an on stage clinic with the remaining time. You are reminded that your performance may not exceed 16-minutes as to give adequate time for the clinician. Following the critique, you will be escorted out of the auditorium stage right and led back to your homeroom. Your groups are encouraged to remain for the full event to support each group.

JUDGING SHEETS—CONCERT CHOIR, MS/JH SHOW CHOIR

Judging sheets will be the same for each judge. Enclosed find copies of the sheets being used by the judges. Your judging sheets and DVDs will be available at the end of the competition. You may pick them up in the Invitational Headquarters found in the IMC.

Critique recordings: Judges critiques will be distributed via "Dropbox". Directors were emailed a dropbox file. After your performance judge's critiques will be uploaded to your own file. You may access these files as soon as they have been uploaded. This will be done throughout the day. You may access them from your computer, Ipad, Adroid phone, or Blackberry. AWARDS PRESENTATION • HS SHOW CHOIRS

The following format will be used for the presentation of awards:

1. Each director is asked to select two show choir members and one back-up combo member to represent their group in the presentation.
2. All students selected as representatives are to be in costumes for the presentation.
3. After the daytime competition, these representatives from each school will be asked to come forward to the stage area in the gymnasium. There will be an assigned area for this presentation. Your room hosts will meet you on stage in your area.
4. At this time all groups will be acknowledged for their participation. The following caption awards will be presented:

Outstanding Female Soloist
Outstanding Male Soloist
Outstanding Crew Award
Outstanding Back-Up Combo Award

5. Announcement of 2nd Runner Up, 1st Runner Up and Champion in Prep Division (Champion will perform in Exhibition during Finals)
6. **To determine performance order in finals.** The top SIX groups will then be announced. The order of performance will be determined by the daytime point totals. Highest scoring group will choose position to perform in finals. Second place in prelims will choose available slots, etc.
7. After the final competition, the awards will be presented as follows:

Best Vocal Ensemble
Most Effective Choreography
Second Runner Up Trophy
First Runner Up Trophy
Grand Champion

SOLOIST COMPETITION FORMAT

1. Each school participating in the FORT SHOWCASE is invited to enter up to five (5) vocal soloists in the separate competition. The singers may be either male or female.
2. Each soloist will be allowed a maximum of five minutes to present his/her selection. The selection should be of a pop or show tune genre.
3. Accompaniment for each soloist may be either by piano or by the use of a CD. A member of your school must be available to assist the sound technician with cuing information.
4. The Soloist Competition will be held in the auditorium where an emcee will introduce each individual singer prior to his/her performance.
5. Each soloist will be scheduled as far away from his/her performance time as possible. The soloist performance schedule will be mailed to each director at least one week prior to the competition.
6. Two soloists, one male and one female, will be chosen as outstanding vocalists for the Soloist Competition. Each will perform his/her selection at the beginning of the evening "Championship Sing-off."
7. The judge for the Soloist Competition will critique the soloist's performance on the following areas: intonation, tone, quality, style, interpretation, diction, poise, presentation, and staging.
8. Following the performance the competition judge will perform a short critique on stage with each participant.
9. Participants are asked to enter and exit from stage right. A stagehand will assist you with entering the stage area at the appropriate time.
10. Practice rooms are available in the music wing adjacent to the choir room. Clavinovas are available for your convenience.
11. **CD players for warm up areas will not be available. Please provide your own CD players for this purpose.
12. **CD accompaniments must be handed to stand hand as soon as possible. Please have TWO copies of the CD.
13. **NO MP3 players please, only CD's.

SET UP

The stage crew will set up equipment provided to your specifications. You may have as many students involved in setting up as you wish. **Stage crew will set up equipment based on the information FAXED prior to the day of the invitational.** Adults may assist, however this will disqualify the group from the “outstanding crew award”.

Keep in mind that the only double door access to the gymnasium is through the commons area.
