#### New Vaccine Requirements for Students for the 2014-2015 School Year

Changes in the Wisconsin Student Immunization law now require a dose of Tdap vaccine in students entering the 6th grade. Parents are required to have their children vaccinated or claim a waiver.

Tdap is the adolescent combination vaccine that protects against tetanus, diphtheria, pertussis (whooping cought). One dose is required.

#### **Exceptions to the Tdap requirements:**

 Tdap vaccine—If your child received a tetanus-containing vaccine (such as Td vaccine after an injury) within the last 5 years of entering the grade it is required, your child is compliant and tDap vaccine is not required.

## PRESIDENTIAL ACADEMIC AWARDS Gold Academic Award

The highest academic honor that a student can achieve in elementary school is the **Presidential Academic Award.** 

This award is given to 5th graders that have demonstrated excellence on standardized achievement test and classroom performance. Each of the following criteria must be met to be considered for this award:

- Score Advanced in reading and/or math on the 4th grade WKCE (state test).
- 2. Score Advanced in reading/and or math on the 5th grade WKCE (state test).
- 3. Have no more than three "2's" in any academic subjects during 5th grade.

#### Silver Academic Award

The Presidential Improvement Award is given to 5th graders based on teacher recommendation. Criteria for this award includes tremendous improvement during 5th grade but the student does not qualify for the Presidential Academic Award.

#### **Old Business**

**School Board Meeting Update**: Fort Atkinson was recognized as one of the Best Music Education schools. Budget reductions were discussed. Open Enrollment numbers continue to exceed number of students going outside the district. Leigh Ann Scheuerell's resignation as Associate Principal at the High School was accepted and she will become the new Purdy Principal. The transition will occur through July.

Market Day: Market Day numbers continue to exceed amount hoped for in budget. The June sale closes at the end of May with delivery on June 4. There will be a mid-July and mid-August order this summer. Flyers for July will go out with students before end of school year. Flyers for August's sale will go home with those who purchased from July or will be available in the office or online. The schedule for next year is being finalized. The pick-up process will be streamlined next year, requiring less work sorting orders when they are delivered.

Flower Sales The flower sale earned a profit of \$850, which is down from previous years. Gift certificates are still available for 1 basket @\$20.00 which can be picked up at Bennett's Greenhouse. Gift Certificates are available in the office and good through July. The flower sale's profit projections for next year was adjusted in the proposed 2014-2015 budget.

**Beek Fair:** The Spring Book Fair was highly successful. The set up, flow and turnout with having it in conjunction with the Arts Festival were all well received. Proposal was accepted to continue to have this at the Arts Festival. Cash profit was taken for this sale.

#### **New Business**

**2014-2015 Proposed Budget:** The proposed budget for the 2014-2015 school year was reviewed. The profit for the Flower Sale was adjusted and balanced with the inclusion of the Sal's Fundraiser to maintain the proposed budget amount of \$19,300. New, large playground equipment to replace the wooden equipment will be the biggest purchase for this budget.

**2014-2015 Board/Chair Positions Accepted:** Board positions were filled for 2014-2015. The chair position for Box Tops have been filled by 2 volunteers, Rebecca Hakenson and Sally Schwarz. Positions remain available for Teacher Appreciation and 5th Grade Breakfast. These positions can be filled by 1 or 2 people who work as a team. We also need 2 additional Scrip chair people to work in conjunction with Justin Luebke—one person with a marketing background and one person in a sale/financial background. Discussion also involved forming a marketing committee to help publicize all events for Purdy. Interested parties can contact Maggie Messler at 920-397-7037 for more information.

**Teacher Appreciation Lunch:** The teacher appreciation lunch is served the first week of June. Maggie will work with Toni to arrange the dinner. Donations of baked goods are requested. Sandwiches and sides will be provided by DTO

**5th Grade Breakfasts** Final details are being made for the 5th Grade Breakfast. Donations were secured from Festival Foods and Kwik Trip to help with the breakfast.

**Spiritwear:** Plans for next year's Spirit Wear were discussed. Tricia will review vendor information gathered by Rachel Broadhead to help determine where orders will be processed for next year. It was decided to have a limited supply of T-Shirts available for purchase at the time of Registration and Back to School Night. It was also suggested to have pictures available on the order form.

**End of the Year Picnic:** The end of the year picnic to honor the retirement of Mr. Brietzke, Mrs. Gomez and Mrs. Nyland will take place on Wednesday, June 4th from 5:30—7:00 pm. Attendees are asked to bring a dish to pass, their own beverages and a blanket to sit on. The event will take place on the east side of Purdy Playground with rain location inside the Gym/IMC. Purdy will provide Hot Dogs, paper products and condiments. A picture will be placed in the paper to invite any former Purdy families to attend.
