New Vaccine Requirements for Students for the 2016-2017 School Year

Changes in the Wisconsin Student Immunization law now require a dose of Tdap vaccine in students entering the 6th grade. Parents are required to have their children vaccinated or sign a waiver.

Tdap is the adolescent combination vaccine that protects against tetanus, diphtheria and pertussis (whooping cough). One dose is required.

Exceptions to the Tdap requirements:

 Tdap vaccine—If your child received a tetanus-containing vaccine (such as Td vaccine after an injury) within the last 5 years of entering the grade it is required, your child is compliant and tDap vaccine is not required.

PRESIDENTIAL ACADEMIC AWARDS Gold Academic Award

The highest academic honor that a student can achieve in elementary school is the **Presidential Academic Award.**

The President's Award for Educational Excellence is awarded to a 5th grade student for their academic success. In order to be eligible to receive this award, the 5th grader must have achieved an "advance" score in math and/or an "advance" score in reading and/or received no more than 3 2's on the 5th grade report card.

President's Award for Educational Achievement ("Silver")

The purpose of this award is to recognize students that show outstanding educational growth, improvement, commitment or intellectual development in their academic subjects. This award encourages and rewards students who work hard and give their best effort in school, often in the face of additional obstacle.
