Why Do We Need A Referendum?

The School District is in the last year of a three-year referendum that was passed in 2011. At the end of this school year the District will lose \$694,000 of revenue as the referendum sunsets. That loss of revenue combined with a lower level of financial support from the State creates the financial burden to be addressed by the April 1st referendum. Although the School District is committed to maintaining and strengthening quality educational programs and services for our students, the loss of referendum dollars and the decrease in State funding will not allow us to do so.

What will this do to my taxes?

It is estimated that there will be a net zero tax impact over the course of the three years of this referendum resulting in no additional tax burden to local homeowners. Due to the financial planning of the District and the prepayment of outstanding debt, it is possible for this referendum to be \$1.75 million without a tax levy increase.

Thank you to the 700 plus community members who completed the Community Feedback Survey regarding the upcoming April referendum. The feedback provided was valuable to the Board Members as they made a very important decision that will dramatically impact the future of the School District of Fort Atkinson. At its January 16th meeting, the Fort Atkinson School Board determined the April 1st referendum amount. The ballot will ask District voters to approve a referendum amount of \$1.75 million for a period of three years which would have no estimated impact on property taxes, yet will require the District to make to up to \$339,132 in cuts for the 2014-15 school year.

Survey Results: The survey that closed on Monday, January 13, had a total of 723 responses. It asked community members to provide feedback on two community advisory recommendations: Option A (\$1.75 million) and Option B which proposed a referendum of \$1.9 million which would minimally increase property taxes over the next three years. The property taxes on a \$175,000 home would increase an estimated \$20 over the next three years. Option B would also have been for three years and would have required up to \$189,132 in cuts for the 2014-15 school year. The results of the survey are as follows:

- In response to the question regarding how likely the respondent would be to support Option A, 70.6% of respondents said they would be supportive of this referendum, while 29.3% replied they would not support this option.
- In response to the question regarding how likely the respondent would be to support Option B, 68.6% of respondents said they would be support of this option, while 31.5% replied they would not support this referendum.
- When asked if the respondent had a preference of Option A or Option B, 45.4% responded that they would prefer Option B (\$1.9 million), 23.1% replied they would prefer Option A (\$1.75 million), 15.6% said either option was acceptable to them, and 16% said neither option was acceptable.

The public was also asked to openly share any thoughts and/or feedback regarding the upcoming referendum with the Board of Education. Some of the themes that emerged from these comments were as follows:

- A \$20 per year tax increase is acceptable if it means fewer cuts to our schools.
- There have been enough cuts to public education and our schools; this referendum is needed to avoid further reductions.
- Option A (\$1.75 million) is the preferable option because it does not raise our taxes.
- The District needs to learn how to live within its budget.
- What are the specific cuts that are going to be made with or without the referendum?
- Why don't we cut all of the "extra" stuff and just teach the basics like math, reading and science?
- Can't the District use the "tools" from Act 10 to balance its budget?

The Board reflected on how multiple survey respondents wanted to know what would be cut if the referendum were unsuccessful. Board members agreed

that they would not be publishing a list of reductions prior to the April 1, 2014 vote. Sentiments were shared regarding how all programs and services are valuable to Fort Atkinson children and help us to meet our mission of providing quality services and opportunities for all students. Board Vice President Rodger Thomann stated that this Board has no desire to put programs and services and their advocates in an adversarial position based on any pending reductions.

The District is working through the comments and developing a questions and answers document to try to address the questions and concerns shared through the survey. This document will likely be available within the coming weeks on the District's website and shared at community engagements in the next couple of months. There will also be an effort to address the main themes of the feedback as the Board meets with the community to share the need for the referendum prior to the April 1 vote.



INCLEMENT WEATHER

It has been quite the winter so far and although we would likely expect to have a snow day or two we have now canceled school for five days, not for snow but for ice and bitter cold temperatures. Here are some answers to the many weather related questions received:

Q: How is the decision made to call off school?

A: Student safety is always the main factor that is considered when making the decision. In doing so, I consult with the bus company and area superintendents. I review weather forecasts, advisories, and warnings. Each situation is unique and is dealt with considering the specific circumstances.

Q: Who is notified of the decision and when?

A: As soon as the decision is made, I get the word out to area television and radio stations. In addition, we post information on our District website and use an automated calling/emailing/texting system to let our families know of the decision to call school. Considering the circumstances and the timing of the decision to cancel school, the automated notices may be targeted at a specific time that is most likely to reach parents. Our goal is to communicate to as many people as we can in the most convenient way and provide families ample notice to make necessary arrangements.

Q: How many snow days do we have?

A: The District allows up to three inclement weather days that to not need to be made up.

Q: Since we have exceeded the three inclement weather days, do we have to make up the days?

A: The answer to this question is complicated and we are currently considering our options. We will let families know as soon as a decision has been determined.

OPEN ENROLLMENT APPLICATION WINDOW February 3 - April 30, 2014

Wisconsin's inter-district open enrollment program allows parents to apply for their children to attend school districts other than the one in which they live.

Important open enrollment dates

- February 3 April 30, 2014 Parents must submit applications online or directly to the nonresident school district.
- June 6, 2014 Nonresident school districts must mail notices of approval or denial.
- June 13, 2014 Resident districts must notify applicants if the application is denied.
- June 27, 2014 Parents of accepted applicants must notify the nonresident district if the student will attend the nonresident district in the 2014-15 school year.

Early Entrance to Kindergarten Screening

The Fort Atkinson School District will hold screening for possible Early Entrance to Kindergarten candidates on April 17th, 2014 at Luther Elementary School.

To be considered for early entrance, your child must reside within the School District of Fort Atkinson boundaries, be intellectually and academically advanced, and not turn five years old by September 1st. School Board Policy requires parents to submit a written request for early entrance consideration by March 1st. Reasons for the request and descriptions of advanced intellectual and academic abilities should be included in the letter. IMPORTANT FACTS

- 1. Students must be five years old by September 1, 2013, and must reside within the School District of Fort Atkinson to attend Kindergarten Orientation at our schools.
- 2. Each session is scheduled for 1 ½ hours which includes activities for the child and their parent/guardian to participate in together.
- 3. For those students who will be attending kindergarten at a parochial school next fall, parents should contact that school for direction concerning their registration process. However, we do ask that you inform the School District of Fort Atkinson of your intentions.
- 4. This orientation is not intended for the district's 4 year old kindergarten. If you have questions regarding 4 year old kindergarten please call 563-7817.
- 5. Because of enrollment numbers and enrollment trends, it is extremely important that you register your child in next year's kindergarten class. Appointments will be made on a first-come, first-served basis.
- 6. If you questions regarding your child's neighborhood school, please contact John Peterson, Director of Pupil Services, at 563-
