**2013-2014 Budget**: At our May Board Meeting, we have our first reading of our budget for next year based on the best information we know at this time. In June, the Board approves a budget to take to our Annual Meeting in July where it is then presented to the electors for approval. In mid-October, and after the third Friday count in September, we learn of our final state aid revenues. Our budget then must be certified by November 1<sup>st</sup>. We are cautiously optimistic that there may be some movement away from the Governor's proposed zero revenue limit increase he proposed in February. At the end of June, the deadline for the legislature to approve the 2013-2015 biennium budget, we should know more about our funding. Upon the legislature finishing their work on the budget, they then forward it to Governor Walker for his approval or veto of all or portions of the biennium budget bill.
