Let me begin by urging you to reconsider the Repair Bill that in my opinion will greatly marginalize the great public school system that you acknowledged we have in the State of Wisconsin in your remarks at the School Board Convention Friday, January 21st.

People understand that the 3 billion dollar deficit facing us is a great challenge for you and the legislature to address in these difficult economic times. Thoughtful decisions, rather than haste action without a good public hearing that extends beyond one day I believe is in order given what is at stake per the welfare of children, public employees, and citizens of this state.

In closing, I plead with you to take some more time and resist the temptation of zealous individuals or groups to "ram this bad legislation through." You are the Governor, the most powerful influence in the state per impacting public policy…Please reconsider the Repair Bill.
