**How to Run For a Seat on the Board of Education**: If you are considering running for a School Board position, I would like to direct you to our website, <u>www.fortschools.org</u>, where you can learn about how to run for a seat on the Board, what the work entails, and the timelines established for running for a seat. We have two seats that are up this coming spring and Mr. Kent Koebke who will be completing his second term (six years total) has declared he will not run again this spring.

Anyone interested in running for one of these seats should contact the District's Director of Business Services, Jason Demerath, in the Luther Administration Center at 201 Park Street or by phone at 920.563.7800. Those interested will be given election materials including an election schedule, a Wisconsin Association of School Board (WASB) Guide for Candidates, and the necessary forms. The deadline for filing the Declaration of Candidacy form and the Campaign Registration Statement is 5:00 p.m. on Tuesday, January 4, 2011. If a primary election is needed, it would be held on Tuesday, February 15, 2011. The elected Board Members would take office on Monday, April 25, 2010.

In my twelve years as Superintendent, it has been a pleasure to work with many dedicated Board Members. Boardsmanship is a time commitment but I think for the most part manageable and most who have served would tell you, the work is rewarding.



**School District Funding and Expenditures in Fort Atkinson**: The Wisconsin School Board Association encourages districts to share such information with citizens, so I hope the information below gives you a good understanding of our operations.

Below are descriptions of our revenue sources. The pie graph gives you a good idea of the proportional share of state aid we receive versus the local burden paid through property taxes.


- State aid revenues: 46.0%
- Local property taxes 41.8%
- Federal aid revenues 5.8%
- Other 3.4 % (includes admissions receipts from athletics and fine arts, student parking fees, athletic participation fees, interest on investments, gifts, drivers' education fees, registration fees, and revenues from rentals, summer school fees and student fines).
- Other 3.0% (includes open enrollment tuition, refunds of prior-year expenses, Medicaid services reimbursement and miscellaneous (liquidated damages from employees, etc.).



## Revenues

## Here is a look at our expenditures:

- Instruction 54.4 %
- Building and Grounds (maintenance) 11.5%
- Pupil Services 9.1 %
- Administration and Finance 6.5 %
- Interest and long term debt 7.2%
- Food Service 3.6%
- Transportation 2.7%
- Other 5.0% (includes technology, telephone service, property liability and workers comp insurance, post-employment benefits, open enrollment tuition (out), and our community service program).



## **Expenditures**

**School Cancellations Due to Weather**: We will utilize our ALERT NOW system in calling homes as soon as a decision is made in the mornings or in the event we would need to dismiss early. In the event this system would fail (unlikely) you would be wise to go to our website for our message, or to listen to WFAW (940 AM). Those are my first two contacts, before I notify the TV stations.

**First Call Reminder per Open Enrollment Application Window February 7-25 before 4 p.m.:** I want to make sure families are aware of the open enrollment window. For families now living in our District who may be considering moving out of our District but wish for their children to remain in the Fort Schools or for parents from other districts wanting to enroll their students in our School District, you may apply <u>very soon</u> on line once the Department of Public Instruction (DPI) prepares their ON-LINE OPEN ENROLLMENT APPLICATION. We will also receive hard copy applications in January.

Please contact my assistant, Debbie Kopps, at 563-7807, for information on open enrollment. The process is very simple and painless; it is just a matter of doing it within the timeline noted above. Any applications coming in after the deadline cannot be accepted per the open enrollment laws. So please mark your calendars and let us help you if you need our assistance.
